



Therapeutic Day Treatment for Children

Overview

St. Joseph's Villa is operating an on site Day Treatment program focusing on children and adolescents. During the school year the program will operate primarily after school for a minimum of two hours per day, and typically will operate from 2:00 until 6:30pm. Children requiring a full day level of care for reasons such as school suspension or school closing will be able to attend the program during the school year and in the summer as a full day treatment program.

Why St. Joseph's Villa Day Treatment?

- St. Joseph's Villa has been providing Therapeutic After-School for over 15 years
- Provides structure to make child successful in all aspects of his life
- Extremely quick turnaround and assessment and determination if program is appropriate
- Anyone can make a referral, and there is no need to go through lengthy approval process

Services Provided

The program utilizes a combination of psychotherapeutic interventions. Clients in the program receive a variety of services including, but not limited to: group therapy, individual therapy, psycho-educational groups, and family counseling. The main component is to individualize a program that meets the needs of the child and the family.

Each child receives:

- A comprehensive diagnostic assessment
- Highly structured program design to address behavioral issues
- Treatment plan and monthly staffing
- Low staff/client ratio 1:5
- Case management services to coordinate between school, home, and treatment program
- Group, family and individual counseling is provided based upon treatment needs
- Monthly parent support groups.

Admission Criteria and Process

Children in this program must be found eligible for services through criteria established by Medicaid. There is no need for FAPT approval or funding approval by CSA. School workers, school administrators, parents, foster parents, and mental health therapists may make referrals. Generally, children who are having extreme difficulties in the community, display constant disruptive behaviors at school, and are at risk from being removed from their home will qualify for this program. A structured therapeutic milieu of activities and interventions will be employed. The goal is for the child to be able to develop adaptive behaviors, which will make him/her successful in their community.



In order to be eligible for services in the Therapeutic Day Treatment program the following requirements must be met.:

- The individual must have minimum IQ of 70,
- The individual must be 5- 17 years of age, and
- The individual must have a mental, behavioral, or emotional illness which results in significant functional impairment.
