



Intensive In-Home Services

St. Joseph's Villa, a leader in caring for children and families for more than 175 years, is proud to offer this new service to families in Central Virginia. Intensive In-Home Services was developed to provide support, guidance, skills training to children who are at risk of being removed from their home because of serious behavioral problems. Our In-Home clinicians are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. With this additional support we help families develop new ways of dealing with old behaviors to break the cycle of destructive behavior.

Services Provided

Some of the interventions include:

- 24-hour emergency response system, including evenings and weekends
- We work with parents/guardians to develop an effective, positive behavioral management system
- Parent training and support
- Individual and family counseling
- Care coordination with community and schools to create a stabilized environment
- Individualized approaches to the uniqueness of the child, guardian, and family environment

Additional services include:

- Diagnostic Assessments
- Crisis Intervention
- Home-based behavioral modification and planning
- Pro-social Skills
- Individual transportation
- Individual service plans
- Referrals for additional services when needed
- Comprehensive discharge planning
- Community involvement

Requirements for Enrollment:

- Child must be demonstrating behaviors that puts him/her at risk at being removed from home.
- At least one parent must be willing to be an active participant in the Intensive In-Home Service.
- Must allow clinicians entry in to their home.
- Service is funded by Medicaid, thus family must meet Medicaid requirements.
